What is Kindness ROCKS and how can it help?



Kindness ROCKS is an educational, interactive & inspirational youth empowerment show, engaging students of all ages with the messages of kindness, empathy, compassion, forgiveness, environmental awareness and social responsibility. By using the power of live music, dance, entertainment and the sharing of true personal stories we are able to convey serious and important messages in a fun, captivating and relatable way. Our goal is to help stop violence, environmental abuse, depression and bullying in schools and communities throughout Canada by

inspiring our youth to take kind and positive action and to let them know how important their words, actions & individual contributions are to the world we live in. The young people of today are our future leaders, parents, teachers and law-makers. We feel that by reaching our youth with these essential messages it will help to inspire long-lasting positive change throughout Canada and our world. Kindness ROCKS has been performing at schools throughout BC for over a decade and has reached over 100,000 BC youth to date.

Show topics and content:

Kindness to Self: Many of the cast members share their personal stories about over-coming different challenges in their lives; From moving to Canada at a young age not knowing the language, growing up with alcoholism & abuse, dealing with low self-esteem, being both a victim of bullying and also sharing what it was like to be a bully! We discuss how our 'Core Beliefs' (what we believe to be true about ourselves) are formed, and how they affect our entire life. We discuss positive ways to fulfill the human need of feeling significant without being destructive to ourselves and others, the power of staying true to yourself, breaking the cycle of being a victim and how to start defining your life's purpose. We impart on the students that we are all human and capable of making mistakes and talk about the power of forgiveness, not only to others but to ourselves.

Kindness to others: We discuss the root causes of bullying and how it is often not about the victim but more about the bully. We discuss the power of our words and actions and impart on the students that they have the power within them to help positively affect the outcome of any situation. We discuss the importance of not being a 'bystander' and how one act of personal power, kindness or compassion towards another (including towards the bullies) can create a positive outcome. We encourage students to make amends with anyone they have hurt in the past and let them know that they can make a fresh start any time they choose.

Kindness to the Earth: We explain our close connection to the earth and how small, individual actions and choices can make a huge impact on the earth. We impart on the students that everything we do matters and we share ideas on things they can do to help make a positive difference.



Student Involvement:

There are a number ways to get your students involved in the Kindness ROCKS show. Here are a few options to choose from...

Student Leaders

Prior to the show, the Kindness ROCKS Producers ask to meet with a group of student leaders who are positive role models in their school to discuss the different issues they are facing in their community and to help brain-storm possible solutions. We are interested in meeting with individuals who connect with their peers in a positive way, regardless of their social status, academic or sports achievements. We feel that by getting key students on board with the initiative of Kindness in their own school it will help keep the positive momentum going long after the show is over.

Student Singers

The choir at the host school (or a choir from one of the schools in the catchment) are invited to join the cast in singing 2 songs during the finale of the show. The choir teacher at the school will be provided with a copy of the song and a lyric sheet in advance to teach the students the song. If your school doesn't have an official choir, we can still involve a group of students who love to sing. The Producers of Kindness ROCKS will come to the school a couple of weeks prior to the show to rehearse with the choir/ student singers as well as share with them some great insights on performance skills and vocal technique.

Student Dancers

If there is a Dance team or simply a group of students who are passionate about dance, we would invite them to choreograph their own dance to one of the songs in the Kindness ROCKS show. We can also arrange to have our Kindness ROCKS Choreographer come into the school prior to the show to work with the student dancers.

Student Technical Crew

This would involve having anywhere between 1 to 4 students assisting the sound & lighting crew with load-in, set-up, sound-check, operating the follow-spot, teardown and load out. This gives the students a great look behind the scenes of putting together the technical side of a show.

Student Film or Photography Project:

Each school that offers a film program or photography course/club, has the option of involving their students in a Kindness ROCKS film and/or photography project. Set-up/ Show duration:

Kindness ROCKS is a large 15 person production and comes with a live band, professional sound & lighting production and technical crew. Set-up and sound-check are done after school the day before the show, so we are ready to go first thing in the morning on show day. Each Kindness ROCKS presentation is 75 minutes in duration and we would do up to 3 presentations in one day for the maximum possible number of students in the community. We aim to have a venue/ gym capacity of about 1000 so we are able to reach 3000 students in one day. Two shows are presented for the student body of the host secondary school and one show is presented for the grade 3 to 7 students from the surrounding elementary/middle schools in the community.

Sample Show Day schedule:

Here is an example of what a show day schedule might look like, although each Kindness ROCKS event is customized to suit the host school's class/ bell schedule.:

Show #1: 9:30am to 10:15am (Grade 3 to 7 students from surrounding schools) Show #2: 10:45am to 12:00pm (Grade 8, 9 & 10 students)

(Cast & crew lunch break)

Show#3: 1:00pm to 2:15pm (Grade 11 & 12 students)

What is required from the host school:

- Access to the gym from 3 pm to 8 pm the day before show day and from 8 am to 5 pm on show day
- We ask the host school to send out an invite to their family of elementary / middle schools (grades 3 through 7) to invite them to one of the shows
- Sufficient power at the venue (6 separate 15 amp wall plugs or access to a 220 range plug)
- A stage (if no stage is available from the school district we can set up on the gym floor)
- 2 Projectors and screens
- Lunch for cast & crew on show day

The atmosphere and energy of Kindness Rocks created helped break some of the barriers and stereotypes that ordinarily influence many students. In particular, new students. As one staff commented, "this was easily the best start to the school year we have had in the 14 years I have been here." I attribute a significant part of the success to the environment Kindness Rocks helped establish. I would like to thank the entire Kindness Rocks entourage for the spirit, enthusiasm and message they delivered to our school.
